

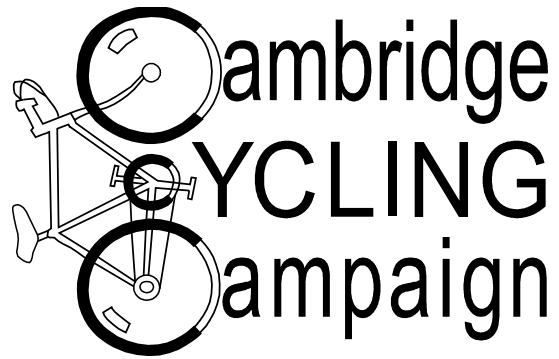

**Netherlands Cycling Study Tour August 2006**

Between the 14<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of August, Cambridge Cycling Campaign is organising a study tour in the Netherlands.

We are inviting one member (or more) of each local political party to accompany us on this tour and would be very pleased if you could provide a representative. We would be especially pleased to have a local councillor join us. Please let us know who you will send by the 8<sup>th</sup> of June.

We will be riding around 70 km a day, which may initially sound daunting but actually comes to just around 20 miles before lunch and the same after lunch. The route will take us through different towns and cities and on long distance cycle routes between built up areas.

There is no charge for coming on the tour, other than covering your own expenses. This will include train fare to Harwich, ferry ticket, accommodation and food. You will need to bring your own bicycle.

More details of the study tour are included in the latest Cambridge Cycling Campaign newsletter. A copy is enclosed.

Cambridge has the highest rate of cycling of any city in the UK. The cycling rate throughout the Netherlands is on average about the same as that of Cambridge.
