We aren't a cycling club, but an organisation of volunteers campaigning for the rights of cyclists and promoting cycling in and around Cambridge. We lobby for better and more convenient conditions for cycling, safer roads, and more people on bikes.

a newsletter six times a year, packed with campaign news, photographs, events and advice. There are regular leisurely rides and social occasions throughout the year. Discounts are offered to members by many local bike shops.

We believe



that cycling is a key part of the solution to local transport problems. This means reduced congestion, less pollution and better health. It is accessible to people of all ages and backgrounds.

But cyclists often get a raw deal, so we need to increase the influence cyclists have on local transport policy and planning, and the behaviour of the traffic around us.
