

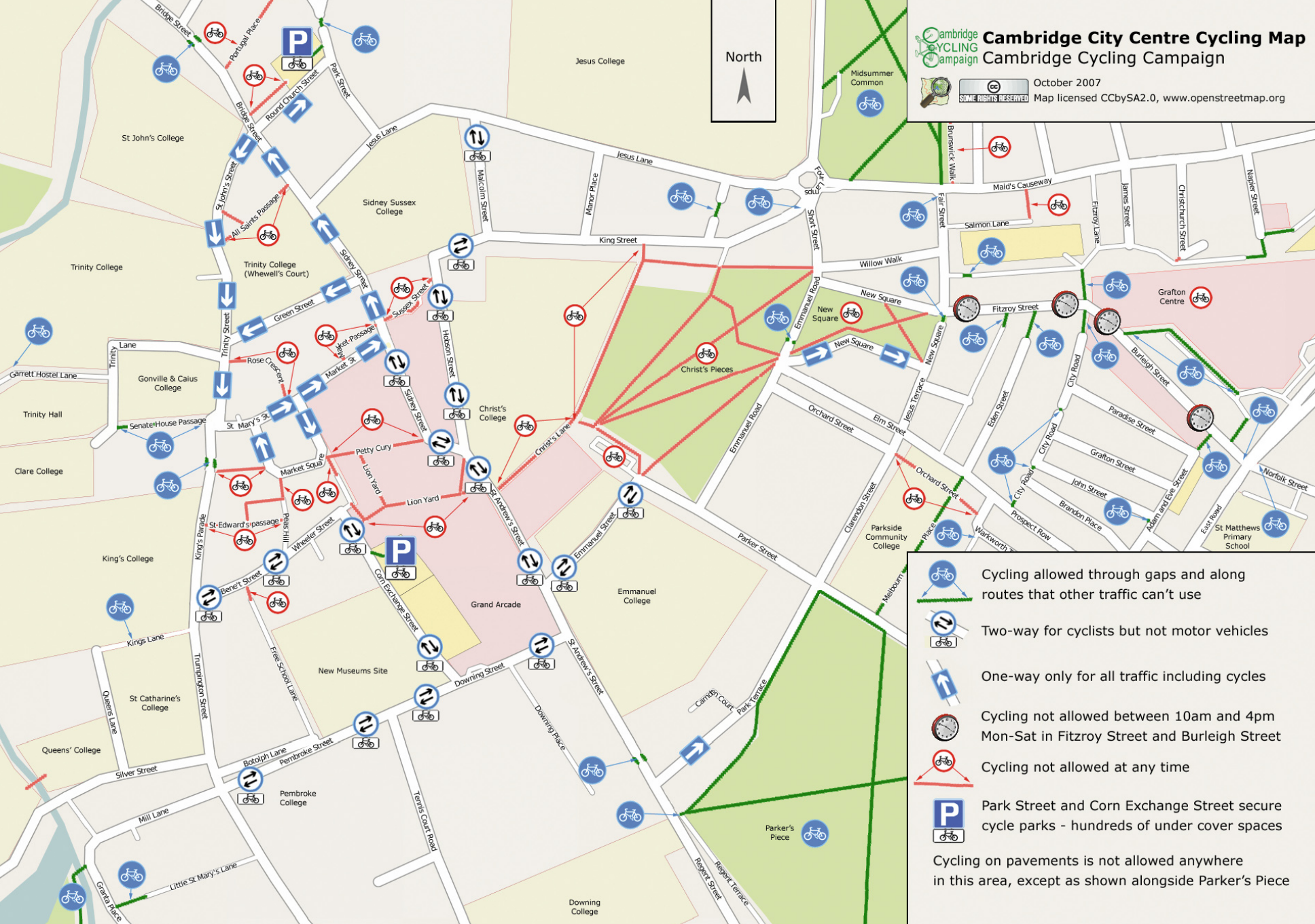
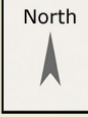








Cambridge City Centre Cycling Map

-  Cycling allowed through gaps and along routes that other traffic can't use
-  Two-way for cyclists but not motor vehicles
-  One-way only for all traffic including cycles
-  Cycling not allowed between 10am and 4pm Mon-Sat in Fitzroy Street and Burleigh Street
-  Cycling not allowed at any time
-  Park Street and Corn Exchange Street secure cycle parks - hundreds of under cover spaces

Cycling on pavements is not allowed anywhere in this area, except as shown alongside Parker's Piece

Where you can and can't ride

Cambridge city centre is very accessible by bike. It's recently been made easier, with more streets open to cyclists and two large cycle parks. Cyclists can use most streets including many where cars aren't allowed. But there are a few streets where cyclists must only cycle one-way or not at all.

Cambridge Cycling Campaign promotes legal, responsible cycling. We have produced this map to help cyclists know where they can and can't ride. It has been carefully checked and agreed with the relevant authorities.

When cycling in the pedestrian zone, please:

- cycle at a reasonable speed
- be prepared to dismount and wheel your cycle if the streets are crowded
- respect the needs of pedestrians and give extra room and time to parents with children, people with disabilities and frail and elderly people

Do not:

- ride on pavements or cycle aggressively
- cycle the wrong way in one-way streets

Remember that pedestrians walking in the road may not be aware of approaching cyclists. They may not hear you or your bike bell.

Reporting crashes:

- Get safe. If the incident is serious and needs police or ambulance urgently, call 999
- Get registration number(s)
- Get contact details for at least one witness
- Take photographs
- Write things down (borrow pen and paper if need be)
- Report it to police: 08454 564 564
- Write a statement as soon as possible

Some household insurance policies may cover you for claims made against you or for legal costs if you have to make a claim against someone else. They often require you not to make any admission of liability without consulting them first, even if you think the crash may have been your fault.
