Cycling in Trinity Street and St. John's Street, Cambridge

Thank you for your letter of 20 November regarding difficulties experienced by cyclists using Trinity Street and St. John's Street in Cambridge. I note your comments.

You are quite right in stating that cycling is permitted, but in a southbound direction only, in these streets at all times. I am aware that some pedestrians misunderstand the regulations in these streets, wrongly assuming that cycling is prohibited, and this can lead to conflict with cyclists. However, I am not convinced that signing would address this.

There would be justified criticism for erecting too many signs in these uniquely attractive streets and I am concerned that signs identifying Trinity and St. John's Street as a cycle route might be misconstrued as identifying all of the pedestrian zone as such. This might lead to more people cycling in St. Mary's Street and Market Street during the 10am - 4pm restricted period.

You and your fellow cyclists may wish to use this letter as confirmation that cycling southbound in Trinity Street and St John's Street is permitted.
